Project Governance and Controls Annual Review (PGCAR, ISSN 2652-1016 (Online)), is a journal published by the Project Governance and Controls Symposium Ltd (PGCS) as an annual online publication. PGCAU highlights the winners of the Walt Lipke award for the current year and including other academic papers of merit that are focused on aspects of PGCS's core mission: ***to enhance the governance and control of projects, programs and portfolios in the Australasian region.*** Publication is in Q4 of each calendar year, following the conclusion of the annual PGCS Symposium.

PGCAR provides a high-quality Australian platform for academicians, researchers and professionals working in the broad field of project management (PM) to impart and share knowledge focused on achieving real improvements in the delivery of project and programs.

All academic papers:

- Should be focused on practical solutions and enhancements in the broad discipline of project, program and portfolio; governance, performance, delivery and/or control.
- Will undergo a rigorous double-blind review prior to acceptance.
- Will, if accepted, be published free of charge to the applicant. PGCS is a not for profit organisation focused on developing the capabilities of the Australasian project community.
- Will be published in the prepress section of the PGCS corporate website on acceptance: <https://www.pgcs.org.au/academic-papers/papers#PRS>
- Accepted papers are automatically eligible for entry in the Walt Lipke annual awards (subject to the award conditions), and may be offered a presentation opportunity at the annual PGCS Symposium held in Canberra.

Types of Paper

The following types of paper can be submitted:

- **Research article:** A report on your original research.
- **Case study:** Focused on problems or opportunities in organisations or projects.
- **Review:** An in-depth overview of a topic or a review of the author's own work or the work of a research group.

Duplicate/previous publication or submission

Papers submitted to this journal must not be under simultaneous consideration by any other publisher and should not have been published elsewhere in a substantially similar form.

Papers prepared for other purposes including: as part of a dissertation, or as part of your academic course work, will be accepted.

Ethical responsibilities of authors

This journal is committed to following the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) guidelines. Authors are required to adhere to recognised good practice, including ensuring:

- The manuscript has not been submitted to more than one journal for simultaneous consideration.
- The manuscript has not been published previously (partly or in full), unless the new work concerns an expansion of previous work.
- No data have been fabricated or manipulated (including images) to support your conclusions.
- No data, text, or theories by others are presented as if they were the authors own (“plagiarism”). Proper acknowledgements to other works must be given (this includes material that is closely copied (near verbatim), summarized and/or paraphrased), quotation marks are used for verbatim copying of material, and permissions are secured for material that is copyrighted.

Important note: the journal may use software to screen for plagiarism.

- Consent to submit the paper has been received from all co-authors and responsible authorities at the institute/organization where the work has been carried out before the work is submitted.
- Authors whose names appear on the submission have contributed sufficiently to the scientific work and therefore share collective responsibility and accountability for the results.

Disclosure of potential conflict of interests

Authors must disclose all relationships or interests that could influence or bias the work, or may be perceived to create influence or bias.

Licencing Policy

The articles published in edited volumes are distributed under the Creative Commons Attribution 3.0 Unported License, a license which allows for the broadest possible reuse of published material. Under this license, authors retain ownership of the copyright for their content, but allow anyone to download, reuse, reprint, modify, distribute and/or copy the content as long as the original authors and source are cited. No permission is required from the authors or the publishers.
