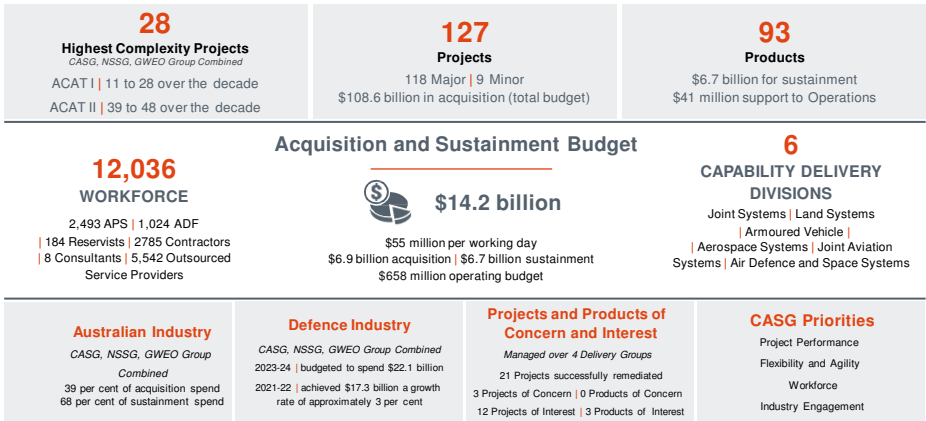

 All figures, aside from Workforce, include Guided Weapons Explosive Ordnance Division which has since been established as a Group.

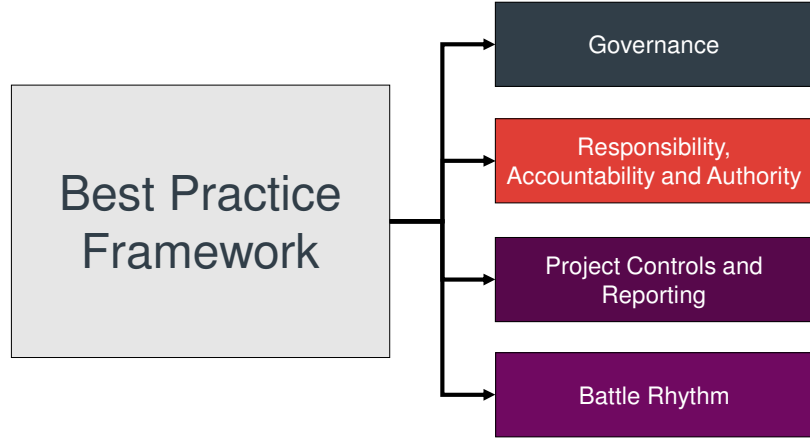

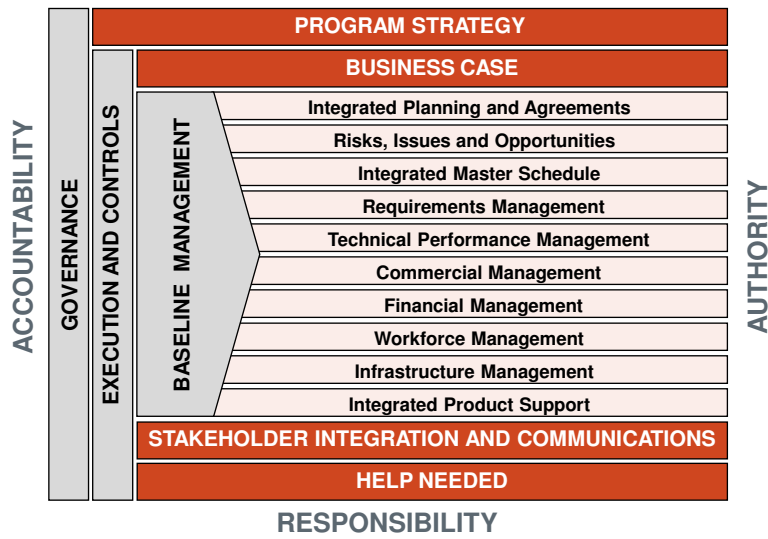
