The Honourable GARY PUNCH MP

Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister For Defence

Gary Punch has been the elected Member to the House of Representatives for Barton, NSW since 1983.

Prior to his move into Federal Parliament as an MP for the Australian Labour Party, Gary had been active in local government and was elected Mayor of the Hurstville Municipal Council in Sydney in 1978 at age 21. Gary held that position until 1983 when he entered the Federal political arena.

Gary Punch was appointed Minister for the Arts and Territories in the fourth Hawke government and held that position from January to September 1988 when a ministerial reshuffle saw him appointed as Minister for Telecommunications and Aviation Support. His opposition to the construction of the third runway at Sydney's Kingsford-Smith Airport led to him resigning his position as Minister in March 1989.

After a further period on the backbench during which Gary was an active member of a number of Parliamentary Committees and held the prestigious position of Chairman Joint Statutory Committee of Public Accounts from May 1990 to February 1993, Gary was appointed Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Defence in the Keating government elected in March this year.

Andrew Podger joined the Australian Public Service in 1968 as a Bureau of Statistics cadet. In addition to the Bureau, Andrew's career has included postings in the Social Welfare Commission, the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet, the Department of Social Security and the Department of Finance. Andrew has also served as Chairman of the OECD Working Party on Social Policy. Six years ago he transferred to the Department of Defence where he was principally involved in pay and service conditions issues for the Australian Defence Force.

In October 1991 he was appointed Deputy Secretary, Acquisition and Logistics and assumed responsibility for a wide ranging portfolio including:

- Implementation of information technology and communications planning.
- Logistics policy and services.
- Defence industry policy and programs.
- Facilities and property management.
- Major capital equipment acquisition.

Within the area of major capital equipment acquisition, one of the issues with which he is currently involved is that of project management and reporting.

In his capacity as Deputy Secretary, Acquisition and Logistics, it is Andrew who signs on the bottom line of any future Australian CSCSC Validation Certificates.
